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The Great Progress of the Gospel

Four thousand years ago, God made a covenant with Abraham, saying "through your offspring all nations (families) on earth will be blessed" (Gen 22:18). God was promising that all people groups would be made right with Him by faith (Gal. 3:8).

Jesus commanded His followers to disciple all people groups (Matt. 28:19). Thus movements to Jesus spread into a growing number of non-Jewish people groups through witnesses like Paul, who said: "It has always been my ambition to preach the gospel where Christ has not been named, not building on another's foundation" (Rom 15:20). In each generation, God calls some, like Paul, to such pioneer work.

In 1792 William Carey worked out that the gospel had spread through cross-cultural witnesses to places containing 25% of the world's population. He triggered an explosion of Protestant missions by urging the formation of mission agencies to reach distant lands. In 1974 Ralph Winter figured that 40% of the world lived in people groups with their own movements to Jesus. He challenged the global church to adopt the remaining unreached peoples. Today in 2024, just 50 years later, the gospel has taken root in people groups containing 75% of the world's population.




Figure 1: The Accelerating Growth of Jesus' Kingdom. Used with permission by RW Lewis.

50 Unbelievable Years

The greatest gospel advance in history came by focusing on God's promise to bless *all* the families of the earth (Gal. 3:8). At the first Lausanne Congress, in 1974, approximately 60% of humanity lived in roughly 17,000 people groups with no known church movements. By 2024 these people groups, now called Frontier People Groups (FPGs), had decreased to 5,000, containing just 25% of humanity. While the global population doubled in 50 years, the number of languages and people groups did not. During this time, the followers of Jesus increased five-fold, while the global population living in FPGs decreased from 60% to 25%.





Figure 2: The World in 1974: 4 billion People. Used with Permission by RW Lewis





Figure 3: The World in 2024: 8 Billion People



Cross-cultural Workers Received: India vs. Africa or Latin America

India's population (1.4 billion) is nearly equal to Africa (1.5 billion), and more than double the population of Latin America (0.67 billion). India has half of the remaining FPGs, but receives 1/10th the cross-cultural workers sent to Africa or Latin America.

Fulfilling God's Promise: Today's Great Opportunity

Over the last 50 years, new movements to Jesus have developed mostly in Buddhist or atheist people groups in Asia, or tribal groups with ethnic religions. These people groups with movements to Jesus are still considered "unreached" until at least 2 out of every 100 people (2%) are Evangelicals.¹

All Unreached People Groups need more Christian workers. But Frontier People Groups (FPGs), those UPGs with no known movements, still need cross-cultural **pioneer** workers trained to disciple the first households to follow Jesus together.

Where is the greatest need today? About 70% of the global population of Frontier People Groups (1.4 billion) live in South Asia. Half are in India alone (1 billion). Of the global FPG population, 97% are either Muslim (56%) or Hindu (41%). Significantly, 80% of the population of all FPGs (1.6 billion) live in just under 300 mega-FPGs, each containing over one million people. Due to their size and influence, these groups are especially strategic. These mega-FPGs are shown below by their geographic location and religions—almost all are Muslims and Hindus. (The world's agnostics and atheists do not appear here because they mostly live in reached people groups, where there are many Christians.)

300 Mega-Frontier People Groups by Religion





Figure 7: 300 Mega-FPGs April 2024. Used with Permission by JoshuaProject.net JoshuaProject.net/frontier/interactive

Key Languages of Unreached People Groups

What languages can new workers learn for greatest access to Frontier People Groups and other Unreached People Groups? Seven of the top ten languages spoken by FPGs and other UPGs are South Asian languages. Furthermore, Hindi and Urdu are so similar that learning either language equips the learner to work among the 700 million people who speak one of those languages.

The 300 mega-FPGs are distributed among just 40 of the world's 200 countries. More than half of these Mega-FPGs are in India. Pakistan runs a distant second, with 41 mega-FPGs. Other countries with Mega-FPGs each have eight or less. This tells us where more pioneer workers are most needed.

Countries with 5 or More Mega-FPGs (by count of "mega" FPGs—over one million in size)




Figure 9: Top 10 Countries of Mega-FPGs. Based on data accessed May 2024 from JoshuaProject.net/frontier/interactive Used with permission by RW Lewis.

Prioritizing the Mega-Frontier People Groups

Rapid progress can be made toward fulfilling God's promise to bless all the families of the world by starting movements to Jesus in 300 mega-FPGs (each over one million in size)—1.6 billion people, 80% of the total population of all FPGs. Within this 1.6 billion, **almost a billion live in the 37 largest FPGs** (over 10 million in size, up to 135 million).² A prayer guide for *The Thirty-One Largest Frontier People Groups* is available at Go31.org and BlessFrontierPeoples.org.




Figure 10: Peoples in Global Perspective. Based on data accessed March 2024 from JoshuaProject.net/frontier/interactive Used with permission by RW Lewis.

Movements with Potential to Spread to Frontier People Groups

The 24:14 Coalition reports that there are now thousands of movements to Jesus (sometimes called Church-Planting Movements or CPMs) with potential to spill over into Frontier People Groups that speak the same language.

Movements Can Spread Through People Group Clusters





Figure 12: 218 Rajput FPGs Accessed February 2024 on JoshuaProject.net/frontier/interactive Used with permission by Joshua Project.

The mega-Frontier People Groups have tremendous influence. The Raiput people groups are a good example of FPG clusters, where movements started in larger groups can lead to movements in smaller related groups. As seen in Figure 12, there are 218 Raiput FPGs—some Muslim and some Hindu. Of these. one is over 10 million in population and 10 more are over 1 million in size (largest circles). Once movements begin in the largest Rajput groups, they can send believers to the 207 smaller Raiput FPGs of the same religion.

Dozens of similar clusters exist, like the Brahmin, Jat, Malay, Yadav, Dhobi, and Pashtun. The Brahmin, for example, have 1 group over 10 million, 9 others over 1 million, and 121 smaller groups, 2 in diaspora (all Hindu). Such clusters reveal why sending additional believing families to work cross-culturally among these 300 mega-FPGs is a priority for the global church.

Defining Movements

A people group is considered to have an indigenous "movement to Jesus" when believers within that group are rapidly winning families to the Lord. When there is a movement, groups of disciples are multiplying from household to household and the number of believers is growing faster than the overall population.

Movements to Jesus flow mostly through same-culture witness within a people group. Movements cultivated among the 300 mega-FPGs can hopefully flow over into many related smaller FPGs and UUPGs.



Bringing God's Blessing to UPGs in Mega-Cities

Today's mega-cities draw people from rural homelands or other countries. Most diaspora immigrants in the West come from reached people groups. However, the 110 cities below include people from many Unreached People Groups, including Unengaged and Frontier People Groups. These immigrants are often isolated in ethnic neighborhoods with their own networks. Urban churches in these cities have the opportunity to start family-based movements in the languages and communities of these UPGs by praying for them and pursuing movement training.

Encouraging Movements in Urban Ethnic Communities

In mega-cities it is common to gather believers together from Christian people groups into multi-ethnic churches using English or trade languages. The gospel rarely reaches the families of UPGs and FPGs, such as Muslims and Hindus.

Most cities are filled with distinct communities of family and friendship circles. Traditional church planting seeks to attract people from their existing communities into a church as a new social circle.

The significant language and cultural barriers of UPG communities means few will be comfortable joining a multi-ethnic church. If they do, their communities often reject them rather than embrace Jesus.

However entire UPG communities can be engaged when the gospel is introduced into families and pre-existing communities, in home-

based discipling movements.

Progress of the Gospel in Mega-Cities

The 18 largest cities from the map shown in Figure 13 have very different levels of gospel progress. In some mega-cities, most of the native people groups are already reached (having more than 2% Evangelicals). Believers there can reach out to families in Unreached People Groups.

However, in countries like India, Pakistan and Bangladesh, the mega-cities are full of people from Frontier People Groups. Other cities, like Tokyo and Bangkok, have a large native UPG population, with some indigenous communities of believers to partner with, but also immigrant groups that are FPGs. These cities need many international witnesses.




Figure 15: Population of top cities in 110 Cities prayer focus. Based on data accessed May 2024 from demographia.com/db-worldua.pdf Used with permission by RW Lewis.

Global Prayer Movements for UPGs and FPGs


God is raising up global prayer movements for Unreached People Groups, especially Frontier People Groups, including prayer for the 110 cities (Figure 13). The 300 Mega-FPGs are also being adopted for prayer. A prayer guide for 31 Mega-FPGs over 10 million in size can be downloaded at Go31.org and with a phone app from BlessFrontierPeoples.org (See appendix for links to global prayer initiatives).

In answer to these prayer initiatives, movements are growing among UPGs and beginning to impact some FPGs that are culturally and linguistically nearby. Once an indigenous self-propagating movement has emerged within a FPG, with at least 1 out of 1,000 identifying with Christ, that UPG can be removed from the FPG list!

Introducing Jesus to Those With Layered Identities

Less than 3% of the population of Frontier People Groups live in diaspora locations (outside their homeland). UPGs living in diaspora often have hybrid or layered identities and are part of multiple social groups. Sharing Jesus with diaspora individuals through their affinity groups has broader impact when those individuals and their households are discipled to follow Jesus in their core or family identity.

A Journey into Layered Identities



Sharmin joins a Multiethnic Fellowship

Working in New York City, Sharmin is discipled in English within an American worldview. Her Sylheti family and friends back home still think she is a Muslim. She is not sure how to share her love of Jesus with them or connect it to her other identities. Marriage is a looming problem.

Sharmin's faith reaches her family

Sharmin's NYC friends encourage her to bless her family and share her faith journey with them. She finds an online Sylheti community of believers. They help her discuss her faith and study the Bible in her heart language and integrate a Biblical worldview into her core identities. Some of Sharmin's family and friends also decide to follow Jesus, and an indigenous movement can start.

Contrasting Gospel Progress in Different Regions

In some regions, indigenous movements to Jesus have moved many people groups out of the "frontier" category. These remain UPGs until at least 2% of their people group follow Jesus. Other areas of the world show less progress.

For example, 55% of Indonesian UPGs no longer need specialized cross-cultural **pioneer** workers to win the first households to Jesus. These UPGs have some believing communities that international workers **partner** with to reach their own people. In the sub-Sahara Sahel region, 50% of the UPGs are no longer FPGs.

However, in South Asia, not many Frontier People Groups show progress toward indigenous movements. Only 15% of South Asian UPGs are no longer FPGs, leaving 85% of South Asian unreached people groups still needing pioneer workers to spark the first movement to Jesus (so these UPGs are still FPGs).

The contrast by population is even greater, with 85% of the population of Indonesian UPGs having some indigenous movements in their own people group and 75% of the people in Sahel UPGs having known movements. In South Asia, however, only 20% of the population in the UPGs have known movements to Jesus, leaving 80% in the Frontier People Groups sub-category.

- **Indonesia**: 55% of UPGs no longer need pioneer workers (85% by population).
- The Sahel (sub-Sahara): 50% of UPGs are no longer FPGs (75% by population).
- South Asia: Only 15% of UPGs are no longer FPGs (20% by population).




Figure 17: Data from JoshuaProject.net/frontier/interactive Accessed March 2024. Used with permission by Joshua Project.

The Surprising Challenge of India

Forty percent more people live in India (1.4 billion) than in North America (0.4 bn) and South America (0.6 bn) combined—nearly as many as in all of Africa (1.5 bn). The Ethnologue lists 4.000 languages in India, using multiple alphabets.

To date, known movements in India have spread mostly among the tribes and lowest classes, leaving thousands of Frontier People Groups still isolated from the gospel.

Why India Has So Little Progress

India has a lower percentage of Christians than almost any other country of the world, in spite of nearly 2000 years of some Christian outreach. The barriers to the spread of the gospel in India are unique.

In most of the world, people groups are concentrated by geography—with everyone in a tribe or village sharing a common identity and interacting in ways that facilitate the spread of the gospel. But in India people groups or castes (except in the tribal areas) were traditionally defined rigidly by profession, and therefore are spread throughout the country and layered in villages. The castes continue to maintain distinct identities even with changing professions. Strong prejudices hinder social interactions and spread of the gospel, even within the same village.

India has more Muslims than the Middle East (200 million). Even India's Muslim people groups are categorized into castes based on their traditional professions. Over 40% of the Frontier People Groups are Hindus—virtually all of them in India.

The Good News: Movements are Multiplying, Even in India

Some movements to Jesus are now spreading through villages of India among the Dalit (outcaste) people groups, which are unfortunately considered ritually "unclean" or "untouchable" by the caste Hindus. If only 10% of each village is Dalit, then the other 90% of each village (in households of upper castes or "Other Backward Castes"/OBCs) often conclude that following Jesus is not possible for their people group. Because Jesus becomes a "god" associated with the "outcaste" groups, the higher castes become even more resistant to the gospel.

Nevertheless, there are some movements developing within higher castes as well. In fact, movements of households coming to Jesus, as seen in the book of Acts, seem to be increasingly multiplying around the world, even in some areas with fierce opposition. Most of these movements seem to be fueled by a paradigm of church that revolves around frequent discussion of and obedience to God's word within households (similar to Acts 19:9-10). Reportedly, many movements to Jesus are doubling every three to five years, growing much faster than the population. An estimated 2% of the world is now involved in movements to Jesus.




Figure 19: Distilled from 2018-2022 Mission Frontiers covers, and from 2414Now.net/resources

Blessing All Peoples: God's 4,000-Year Old Promise

God wanted to make the unchanging nature of His purpose very clear to the heirs of what was promised, so He confirmed it with an oath (Heb 6:17).

The Promise

God promised Abraham twice (Gen 12:3, 18:18) that all the family-lines of earth would be blessed through Abraham's seed, Jesus, God then confirmed this promise with the oath referenced above: "I swear by myself," declares the LORD, "... through your offspring



all ethne³ (people groups) on earth will be blessed..." (Gen 22:16–18).

The **Old Testament** repeatedly refers back to this promise: *all* ethne *will be blessed* through him, and they will call him blessed (Ps 72:17)... the ethne will invoke blessings by Him and in Him they will boast (Jer 4:2).



Peter sees the Spirit's empowering at Pentecost as fulfillment of this promise: And you are heirs... of the covenant God made with your fathers... "Through your offspring all ethne on earth will be blessed" (Acts 3:25).

Paul identifies this promise of God as the gospel itself! Scripture foresaw that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, and announced the gospel in advance to Abraham: "All ethne will be blessed through you" (Gal 3:8). I do not want you to be ignorant of this mystery... Israel has experienced a hardening in part until the full number of the ethne has come in (Rom 11:25). Paul applies this: It has always been my ambition to preach the gospel where Christ was not known, so that I would not be building on someone else's foundation (Rom 15:20).



Jesus relates His mission, and even His daily presence with us, to this purpose: All authority... has been given to Me. Therefore go and disciple all ethne ... And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age (Mt 28:18-20)... And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all ethne, and then the end will come (Mt 24:14).

Finally **John** foretells the fulfillment: with Your blood You purchased for God persons from every tribe, language, people and ethne (Rev 5:9)... a areat multitude... from every ethne, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb... (Rev 7:9)... All ethne will come and worship before You... (Rev 15:4). On each side of the river stood the tree of life... And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the ethne. (Rev 22:2).

³ The word "nations" in the New Testament is mostly the Greek ethne—people groups that resist outside influences and maintain their distinct lineage through intermarriage and shared customs. The Septuagint (LXX)—the earliest Greek translation of the Old Testament – uses this same word ethne 700 times, including this promise in Genesis.

Conclusion

Because the percentage of the world's population that is Christian has remained around 33% for the last century (see graph below), most people miss the fact that the gospel has been spreading into new people groups at an exponential rate. Progress is accelerating rapidly toward the fulfillment of God's promise to bless all the families of the earth, justifying all by faith in the Lord Jesus. In the last 50 years, a new awareness of God's concern for *all* people groups has dropped the percentage of the world's population still needing pioneer work from 60% to 25%.

- Today God is sending workers to least-reached people groups from many countries that were considered mission fields just 50 years ago.
- Global prayer networks have arisen for UPGs (including FPGs).
- Ministries and whole denominations are collaborating more fruitfully.
- Movements are already present within some people groups that are geographically, culturally and linguistically near to Frontier People Groups.
- God has entrusted His body with many new technologies, including real-time translation, instant communication, rapid travel, and online communities.

Starting movements to Jesus in the 37 largest Frontier People Groups (greater than 10 million in size) would impact almost 1 billion people! This number increases to 1.6 billion (80% of people in FPGs) when movements to Jesus spread to the rest of the 300 mega-FPGs (greater than 1 million in size). Through the global church, God is fulfilling His promise to bless all the families of the earth!
